## East Shore Park Urban Oases 410 Woodward Ave, New Haven, CT

As part of the New Haven Harbor Urban Refuge Partnership, habitat improvements are taking place at New Haven parks, schools and other urban green spaces. Native trees, shrubs, and flowers have been planted to provide cover, food, and habitat for wildlife and a place to learn, relax, and connect with

nature for people. Audubon Connecticut is looking for help monitoring birds at these *Urban Oases* to determine whether habitat restoration is working.

To participate, visit an Urban Oases and keep a record of all the birds you see or hear. Then enter your observations for **just the demonstration site** into <u>www.eBird.org</u>. You can visit as many times as you'd like, at any time of the day. Mornings, particularly in Apr.-May and Aug.-Oct. when birds migrate is recommended.




## Driving and Parking Directions for East Shore Park:

From the North or West: Take I-95 North to Exit 50 Woodward Ave. At the light, take a right on the Woodward Ave. As you travel down Woodward Ave., you will see East Short Park on your right. Just past the large United States Fish & Wildlife Service sign and playground/tennis court area there is a large parking lot where you can park.

From the East: Take 1-95 South to Exit 51. At the 3<sup>rd</sup> light turn left on to Woodward Ave. Then follow the above directions.

**Getting to the Demonstration Site:** The urban oasis site is on the north side of the tennis courts. Look for the colorful interpretive signage, it is visible from Woodward Ave.
