As part of the New Haven Harbor Urban Refuge Partnership, habitat improvements are taking place at New Haven parks, schools and other urban green spaces. Native trees, shrubs, and flowers have been planted to provide cover, food, and habitat for wildlife and a place to learn, relax, and connect with


nature for people. Audubon Connecticut is looking for help monitoring birds at these *Urban Oases* to determine whether habitat restoration is working.

To participate, visit an Urban Oases and keep a record of all the birds you see or hear. Then enter your observations for **just the demonstration site** into www.eBird.org. You can visit as many times as you'd like, at any time of the day. Mornings, particularly in Apr.-May and Aug.-Oct. when migrating birds will be using the sites, are recommended.



Driving and Parking Directions for Long Wharf Nature Preserve: To visit the *Urban Oasis* at the New Haven Land Trust's Long Wharf Nature Preserve park at the Sound School Parking Lot at the end of Sea Street in the City Point neighborhood in New Haven.

Getting to the Demonstration Site: Walk towards I-95 along the gated access road next to the sea wall and Bayview Park. At the end of the access road, follow the foot path to the right to enter the nature preserve. The Urban Oasis is located just at the entrance to the preserve. Follow the path further to enjoy the rest of the preserve.
